Travel and Set up Schedule Sat. June 29 - July 6 2024 E4K for VT, NH and MA

Heads up! These are a bit different this year. We are meeting at a new location! Please read the whole document through.

MEETING PLACE: 11 AM Arrive at Mullers home in Lyndonville. Everyone coming from NH, VT, or MA will be meeting at the home of the Mullers in Lyndonville, VT. **113 South Street, Lyndonville, VT 05851**. The Muller family is graciously allowing the team to use their 12-passenger van. They live one hour south of the border. We will pack vehicles and trailer there.

Arriving in Lydonville: TRAVELERS FROM NEW HAMPSHIRE AND MASS: These 6 people [Livia, Eli, Eliana, Lydia, Dominic, Gavin, Brandon, and Ethne] will join us in Lyndonville, arrangements to be determined.

Note: I am assuming that Livia and Eli Wilder will come directly to Lyndonville from their home; it's only about 1 hr away. Could some girls get rides to their house and come with them?

Note#2: I realize that Gavin and Ethne both are good drivers, but our safety policy requires drivers age 21 or over, so our church mission policy is that that these people do drive team members other than their own family and with their own parent's permission.

Note#3: If necessary, cars can be parked for the week at the Muller home safely. Leave keys with them.

TRAVELERS FROM VT: Olivia will bring Isobel, Emma and Aidyn on Saturday morning from the Barre area. Adara, Phoebe, Fiona and Henry will meet us in Lyndonville.

At the Muller's home, you can use the bathroom, pack your stuff in the car, check Border Id's. There is a convenience store a few blocks away for last-minute purchases if necessary, or stop on the way.

In Lyndonville:

- Take a group picture
- Put all suitcases in the vehicles.
- Check everyone's ID and Notary form, gather in correct vehicle

By 12 pm leave Mullers -- Driving through the border:

A note about Travel / Hanging out music during our mission trip: Folks, I am going to ask that in the vehicles and in the camp in general we keep to Christian, folk, or classical music. This is not because I think all secular music is of the devil. But we are on a special trip serving the Lord. We have one week of the year to spend together. I just do not want Taylor Swift, the Rolling Stones, the Beatles or Carrie Underwood crooning in my brain or yours. I am not against love songs, but love is the main subject of pop music, and we don't really need to be focusing on that on this trip, not romantic love, anyway. Plus, some families have different rules about music so this will keep us in the zone for everyone. This can be a big deal for some; I know that music is fun and lots of this music is not inappropriate or evil; it's a matter of individual and family conscience. I have my favorites too. But let's just leave secular music at home, and Yes that's just a decision I have made for all of us. It's easier to warn you in advance. Gotta love me!

RETURN PICKUP Plans:

RETURN SCHEDULE Leave by 10 AM from St Georges. On July 6 we will be going to Quebec City as a group on that last Saturday.

My husband Carl will drive his car to St Georges on Friday afternoon. He will go to QC with us and bring 4 bodies home. Marilou and QC staff teens are joining us in Quebec city but will drive back to St Georges directly in her van.

We will leave Quebec city about 2-3 pm, which puts us back in Lyndonville at the Mullers between 5 and 6 PM, probably. We can text parents along the way for time estimates.

You will need to buy one meal while traveling home – save some US money for that. Your meal and any souvenirs in Quebec City come from your own money.

** We will need another 1 or 2 parents to meet us at the Muller home in Lyndonville and carry bodies back. There will be 6 bodies so we will need space for them, one or two vehicles.

** My experience is that teens are very tired after our strenuous mission trip. I suggest strongly that we have fresh drivers meet us in Lyndonville at the Mullers to reach final destinations safely. The Mullers have also have plenty of space for teens to sleep over in their large Victorian house, if you want to pick them up on Sunday. Drivers under 21 should not drive team members who are not their own family members, as per our church policy.

 Goodbyes! After unpacking, Olivia will be driving back to Barre with Isobel, Aidyn and Emma.

A final concern is the following from Conference's Guidelines for Volunteers and Caregivers. There should never be only one adult serving as a caregiver. This is often difficult when arranging transportation. It is critical for the safety of everyone involved that there are two unrelated adults be traveling together (in the same vehicle or vehicles traveling together) when officially transporting children on behalf of our ministries.
