From Martin Luther's Preface to the Psalms

The book of Psalms could well be called a "little Bible" since it contains, set out in the briefest and most beautiful form, all that is to be found in the whole Bible. The Psalms are unique when we compare them with the multitude of other books which continually babble about the saints and their doings, but seldom or never quote their words. It tastes good and sweet to read the Psalms, for they give a faithful record of what the saints of old did and said: how they communed with God and prayed to Him in the old days, and how such men still commune with Him and pray to Him ...

What the Book of Psalms gives us in richest measure is the fullness of certainty as to what believers felt in their hearts, and what was the sound of the words which they used in addressing God and their fellow-men ...

It is therefore easy to understand why the Book of Psalms is the favorite book of all the saints. For every man on every occasion can find in it Psalms which fit his needs, as if they had been set there just for his sake ... (and) when some such a word has come home and is felt to answer his need, he receives assurance that he is in the company of the Bible's saints, and that all that has happened to saints in Scripture is happening to him, because all of them join in singing a little song with him, since he can use their words to talk with God as they did."

"When I first read Ps 31:1's words, 'deliver me in your righteousness,' I felt deep hostility towards the words, 'God's righteousness.' I knew only that 'the righteousness of God' meant a harsh judgment. Was God to save me by judging me harshly? If so, I was lost forever." (Luther)
