Psalm 90:1-17

I. Behold God the Eternal! (and Mankind Lost in Time)

Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God. You return man to dust and say, "Return, O children of man!" For a thousand years in your sight are but as yesterday when it is past, or as a watch in the night. You sweep them away as with a flood; they are like a dream..... (vss. 2-6)

II. Behold God, the Infinitely Pure! (and Mankind Lost In Sin)

All our days pass away under your wrath; we finish our years with a moan. (vs. 9)

III. Behold God the Gracious! (and Mankind, Found In God's Covenant Love)

Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days. (vs. 14)

A. The Grace of Wisdom

Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom. (vs. 12)

B. The Grace of Deliverance from Sin and its Curse

May your deeds be shown to your servants, your splendor to their children. (vs. 16)

C. The Grace of Meaningful Labor

And let the beauty of the LORD our God be upon us: and establish thou the work of our hands upon us; yea, the work of our hands establish thou it. (vs. 17 KJV)

Conclusion

The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.
